### GILBERT L. DELGADO

Dr. Gilbert L. Delgado has devoted his entire professional career to working with deaf people. Graduating with a master's degree in education from Gallaudet University in 1954, he worked as a residential school teacher and administrator in New Mexico and California. Returning to Washington, DC, Dr. Delgado completed his doctorate in special education at the Catholic University of America and worked at the United States Office of Education where he became Chief of the Media Services Captioned Film Branch.

Coming back to Gallaudet, Dr. Delgado served as Graduate Dean and Assistant Vice President for Academic Affairs. Very active in international activities on behalf of deaf people and Gallaudet University, he helped to create the International Center on Deafness. He later solidified its budget and helped to add two international extension centers.

Dr. Delgado visited more than 35 countries in his efforts to help them begin deafness-related programs. In 1973, he served as a consultant to the Organization of American States. He has been most active helping developing countries, notably those in South and Central America. Dr. Delgado has been honored for his work by associations in Spain, Uruguay, Pakistan, and France.

Dr. Delgado has published extensively. His writings feature research on international programs for deaf people, Hispanic deaf children, and most recently on deaf children and adults in Costa Rica.

A native of New Mexico, Dr. Delgado returned home where he is currently the superintendent of the New Mexico School for the Deaf. He still keeps in touch with countries to our south.
